- NOTE: If a landlord wants to evict you, a notice or letter must be served to you by the landlord or an attorney. To appeal the eviction, you must respond to the court within the given time frame. IF YOU DO NOT RESPOND YOU MUST MOVE. If you do not move, the sheriff's department can forcibly remove you from the premises.


